Last night I attended 'The Resilience Project' presentation at the Ulumbarra Theatre. It was great to see and hear Hugh Van Cuylenburg talk to the audience about TRP and the guiding principles. Changing our perspective to look at failure or mistakes as opportunities to learn or grow, rather than focussing on the negative. Every experience we have is an opportunity to learn/grow.

I highly recommend his book, *The Resilience Project* to all of our parents and carers. It is such an easy read and it will also provide insight into the three core elements your children are learning here at school every week.

⇒ If you have more than one child, please ensure that each child orders on an individual profile.

⇒ Please check what YEAR and CLASS your child is setup against. This is important to ensure your child's order is sent to the correct room at lunchtime. All the orders are printed on stickers each week which are autogenerated from the QKR app and then placed on the bag/package, and if the stickers are incorrect, the order will go to the wrong room. You can check this by going to the profiles in Lockwood Primary School.

⇒ If you are letting your child order themselves via the app (which is great to see!) please check afterwards what they have ordered. The easiest way to check is to look at your payments (refer to the tip of the week)

We are starting to see more and more orders that are against the wrong child or wrong class, and it gets very confusing on canteen day.

TIP OF THE WEEK

**Q. How can I keep track of my Qkr! payments?**

A. Itemized Qkr! eReceipts provide a record of purchase and are a convenient way to keep track of your Qkr! payments.

**To view your eReceipts:**

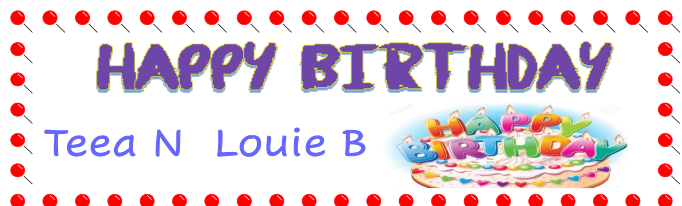
1. Open Qkr! and tap 'Activity'.
2. Scroll down to 'Order History' and tap 'Receipt' to view eReceipts.

**Never lose a receipt: email receipts to your account:**

1. Select the eReceipt you wish to email to yourself.
2. Tap on the mail icon at the top right of your screen.
3. Tap 'Send' to email the eReceipt to your email address, or enter another email address, and tap 'Send'.

**Use an eReceipt to cancel a food order you have paid for:**

1. Select the eReceipt for the order you wish to cancel.
2. Tap the red circle with a minus symbol on the order to be cancelled. Select the entire order or individual items to cancel and tap 'OK'.
3. Cancelled items are shown in red on your eReceipt confirming they have been cancelled and a credit is available for future food orders. The value of any credits will be automatically deducted from your next Qkr! food order.

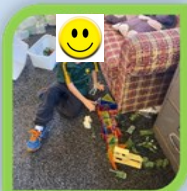
