OSHC – A GREAT OPTION FOR BUSY FAMILIES



Option 2 is to send the order form, along with money/cash back to the school office. If you do send in cash, please ensure that it is the correct value and in a sealed envelope with the order enclosed.

STEM BILLY CART INCURSION

On Tuesday we had Emma from Supreme Incursions come to the school to facilitate Billy Cart workshops for all our students. The students participated in two groups, Foundation to Year 3 and Year 4 to Year 6. The students rotated through various stations where they engaged in activities such as

- creating a vehicle out of various materials to gain an understanding of how simple machines contribute to an effective design
- work as a team and use problem solving skills to follow a set of instructions to replicate a build design
- design and test a team-designed vehicle, considering how friction and gravity affect its performance
- explore the concepts of push and pull while taking turns racing around the Supreme track in the PE Shed on Billy Carts and Ezy-Rollers.

It was great seeing so much teamwork and the wonderful smiles on our students faces, whilst immersed in STEM learning.
